Welcome to New General Manager

Walters Miranda

Walters Miranda brings to the position of Honolulu Park Place's General Manager extensive knowledge and experience which enable him to strategically carry out the abilities of his

new position. He has over 20 years of hotel engineering experience and 14 years of condominium management experience. He retired in 2001 from the Army National Guard Engineer Detachment as Sergeant in charge of



major projects from around the world. He was responsible for putting up structures from the ground up to the completion of the projects including the performance of quality control. This position gave him the opportunity to enhance his experience and knowledge of all the trades.

As Manager of Operations from May 2014 to December 2017, he was supervisor of maintenance and custodial staff and he had oversight of security operations under the supervision of the Chief of Security. One of his goals was to train maintenance staff on proper building techniques and building codes so they can diagnose areas that require repair and provide better service to the residents. He supervised improvement projects such as the installation of the new chiller, new carpet and LED lighting; redoing the landscape of exterior and interior areas; resurfacing the tennis court; regrouting of the jacuzzi; and improving the koi pond filtering system and the jacuzzi jets.

As General Manager, Walters is looking forward to ongoing improvement of the interior and exterior common areas including the cleaning of unit drain pipes; changing the garage fire sprinkler heads; clarifying emergency procedures for residents; improving locker rooms; changing the entrance glass doors to a sliding door to facilitate entry for residents with special needs; renovating the Long House; resealing the tiles fronting the fountain; renovating the security

desk which is termite infested; working with the HPP Board and residents on the functionality and use of the bowling lanes; and maintaining a safe and secure environment for residents.

Walters' overarching goal is to encourage and promote a culture among all HPP staff to move forward as a team to meet the needs of residents. He is quick to give credit to all the HPP staff for the successful implementation of past projects, and he looks forward to working with them to maintain and improve the living environment at Honolulu Park Place.

Are you ready?

If you're like most people, the events of Saturday, January 13, 2018 very likely caused you to think seriously about your emergency preparedness. While Hawaii is a wonderful place to build a life and raise a family, it's also a place that is threatened by many potential disasters, both natural and those made by man. Emergency preparedness in Hawaii means planning for hurricanes, tsunamis, floods, earthquakes and, at least on the Big Isle, volcanos.

It is recommended that you and your family review your emergency planning now. In doing so, you might want to look at www.ready.gov. The State of Hawaii has a good information posted on its Hawaii Emergency Management Agency site: www.dod.hawaii.gov/hiema. That site includes Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) about the nuclear threat from North Korea. Contrary to popular opinion, planning for such an attack is not a futile exercise as much depends upon the size of the weapon and its point of impact.

Whether the threat comes from a natural or a man-made source, your emergency planning should include **a survival kit sufficient for 2 weeks** due to the possibility of a major disruption to maritime transportation.

Turn the unfortunate events of January 13 into a positive by reviewing your preparedness for an emergency. An emergency preparedness pamphlet is available in the HPP admin office.
