#### Why should you care about this?

Annual meetings usually address topics that may sound dry as dust to you, as a homeowner. These might include the association's budget, election of directors, and voting on amendments to the HOAs governing documents. The meetings can also address other issues the board believes need the attention of the entire membership.

Attending the annual meeting is nevertheless important (and may be more interesting than you expect.) The decisions being made may, after all, directly impact your quality of life and the value of your property.

You may ask, why do maintenance fees have to increase every year? Or is it better to have a special assessment to take care of property issues? Our building is now nearly 30 years old and some of our many systems are wearing out and are beyond their expected life.

A homeowner may want to make sure directors are elected to the board who will make good decisions for the community as a whole, as opposed to decisions that benefit his or her friends.

We have three openings for board directors whose terms are expiring. **Trappeur Rahn** and **Craig Williams** are standing for re-election. **Charles "Chuck" Arthur** has placed his name for nomination. Other nominations may be made from the floor.



## Have you looked at our building lately?

People have noticed that the window tint film on many apartment units has started to peel and crack, resulting in an unsightly appearance from the outside.

Why do we have tinting film on the windows? Tint can reduce up to 84% of solar heat, making your home more comfortable. We can cut energy costs, making our air conditioning run more efficiently and lowering our electric bills. Window films reduce 99% of ultraviolet rays, the primary cause of fading to furniture and cabinetry. They also reduce heat and glare, the other two main causes of fading.

The management of Honolulu Park Place has already identified apartment units whose window tint needs replacement, and will be sending a special letter to homeowners.

The good news is that AMCO, the original installers of the window tint, has given HPP a wholesale bid and excellent price to replace the film. Window tint film that does not meet qualifications shall constitute a violation of the House Rules. Any removal and replacement of window tint film shall be at the owner's expense.
