

Our General Manager, Garry Belen, will be retiring from his position on December 31, 2017. He has the distinction of having the longest term of employment than any other staff member at Honolulu Park Place. Beginning with his employment as a maintenance technician in 1995, he moved up quickly through the ranks till his appointment in 2005 as Operations Manager and then in 2013 as General Manager.

"Solving problems, making residents and staff happy, and giving them more than what they expect from me" is what gives him satisfaction at the end of the day. Garry strives to be better each day than he was the day before.

Under his management, the execution of major projects includes installation of new carpeting throughout the condo; overhauling of cooling towers; replacement of the chiller; and painting of the building. Another significant contribution is the use of HPP staff to perform some maintenance and repair work, thus minimizing costs by the elimination of contractors.

Garry served in the National Guard for twelve years beginning in 1977. In 2001, he rejoined the National Guard, and in 2007, he was sent to Iraq for one and a half years as a UH-60 Black Hawk Helicopter mechanic. In 2011, he served in Kuwait and Saudi Arabia for one year as a quality control technician inspector. After his return from Kuwait, he received training as an army instructor. He taught Warrior Leadership

Courses (WLC) to young soldiers.

Garry has five of his six daughters and seven of his eight grandchildren in North Carolina. The others reside in Florida. After retirement, he plans to move to North Carolina, buy a large acreage of land, build a home, and devote the rest of his life to his family.

## A veteran among us

**Ty Kimura** had a distinguished military career. Upon graduation from the University of Hawaii in 1967 as a distinguished military graduate, he was commissioned as a second lieutenant and began his six-year military career.

His military training included Air Defense Artillery Officers Course, Area Intelligence Course at the Military Intelligence School, training at the Ranger School, Special Forces School, and Jungle Operations School.



Ty was assigned as Advisor and Special Weapons Custodian to a Belgian Missile Unit in Northern Germany. In Vietnam, he served as Province Senior Intelligence Advisor for Vinh Long Province in the the IV Corps Tactical Zone. His second assignment in Vietnam was with the Military Assistance Command Studies and Observations Group (MAC SOG) in a Special Forces (Green Beret) capacity. In Japan, Ty was assigned to the 500th Military Intelligence as an Operations Officer and subsequently as Interim Detachment Commander. He retired from military service in



1973, but was recalled to active duty service from 1983 to 1984 at the Special Operations Command Pacific (SOCPAC).

In federal government civil service from 1984 to 2002, Ty served in the antiterrorism/ counterterrorism and intelligence fields for

the Department of Defense (U.S. Pacific Command), U.S. Army (USARPAC), U.S. Air Force (5th AF/USFJ), and U.S. Navy (IPAC).

These days, Ty enjoys a low-profile lifestyle. He tries to maintain a regimen of swimming and working out at the gym at Honolulu Park Place.

A highlight of his life is visiting his granddaughters on the Mainland. "They are as dear to me as my three children, Troy, Kris, and Nagisa."
