Dr. Chan Cheng King was born in 1920 in Vietnam. After he completed his Master of Science and Doctoral degrees in Botany at Penn State University in the record time of twenty-seven months, he was hired by his alma mater as Associate Professor. In 1982, he retired from Penn State University after an illustrious academic career.

Dr. Chan, his late wife, and son were among the first owners to move into Honolulu Park Place in May 1991. He has the distinction of being our oldest owner-resident. In addition to Mandarin, he has fluency in English and Cantonese. His insights on global historical events and his extensive biblical knowledge are impressive. His faith and church activities have been a significant part of his life.

Dr. Chan lives with his son, Dr. Chan Yan-pui, who has a downtown dentistry practice. He also maintains close ties with his daughter, Dr. Sophia C. Young, a neuro-radiologist in New Jersey.
