Making HPP a Better Place for You!

Look around our Honolulu Park Place campus and you'll see improvements everywhere you look!

Starting at the front door, our signature **front fountain** has been repainted and is again up and running. Repairs had been delayed due to the lengthy wait time for the fountain motor.

Inside the lobby area, all four elevators are now running, after **Elevator #1** was out of service for over a month. This was due to having to wait for the arrival of a replacement traveling cable.

One of the biggest changes has been to the renovated **BBQ Hales** on the eighth floor. We have brand new barbecue grills, counters and sinks, plus the overhead ceilings have been repainted.

Here's what Board Member Dennis Padlock wrote: Huge Mahalo to Walt and the entire HPP Staff for all the work they did on the renovation of the Hale BBQs. ...today I cooked two steaks to perfection... after getting some "seasoning" the grills are working great. I would like to note the cleanliness of the area was outstanding. We worked on this project for almost one year and it is very satisfying to experience such an improvement. If you have not had the opportunity to try the new grills, I strongly recommend it.

We do ask, however, that you **clean the grills after you use them**, especially if you are cooking meats with a gravy or sticky barbecue sauce. There is a cleaning brush supplied for this very purpose. As nice as the grills are, they are requiring *three hours* of our maintenance staff's time *every day* to clean them! Please treat the grills as though they were in your own kitchen—clean up after yourself!

Were you here when the new **hot water storage tanks** were transported via helicopter to the rooftop? This was a huge project that will insure that we have hot water on all floors of the building.

Some residents have complained, however, that their hot water is not as hot as before, or that the temperature of the water varies between the bathroom and the kitchen. If this is happening in your unit, please check that the shutoff valves and sink strainers are not clogged.

At the same time that the heat pumps were

delivered, the **air conditioning in the hall-ways** of the upper floors was replaced.

Plans are underway to renovate the **Long House** with new furniture and flooring.

We love our pets!

Pets are a common and beloved addition to most American households. According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, of households with pets, 35 percent have dogs, 30.4 percent own cats, and 3.1 percent have birds. When a person lives in an apartment or condo, their pet lacks the space that animals living in larger dwellings may have. To prevent potential



problems from arising, pet owners should put careful thought into choosing the right type of pet to suit their lifestyle and their living space. In addition, a pet owner must also meet the animal's needs in terms of providing them with the proper care.

Honolulu Park Place is a building which allows pets ... but because we live in a community, there are rules which ensure that the common areas are kept clean for everyone. Please review these statements from the House Rules:

One dog or two cats (spayed, if female) not to exceed a total aggregate weight of 25 pounds in adult weight per unit for owners or tenants will be allowed.

Responsibility of Pet Owners: Pet owners shall be responsible for their pets at all times while at the Project. All pets must be carried and on a leash while in the common areas, including elevators, garage and lobby. [This also includes the hallways.] Pets are not allowed to roam the common areas at will at any time. Pet owners are responsible for the immediate clean up after their pets in the event of any accident. Pet owners are responsible for undue noise made by their pets. If the pet causes any nuisance or any unreasonable disturbance to any other occupant of the Project, it shall be permanently and promptly removed upon notice given by the General (or Resident) Manager or the Managing Agent.

Injury and/or Damage Caused by Pets: Apartment owners are responsible and liable for any injury caused by a pet and any damage to the building, grounds, flooring, walls, trim, finish, tile, carpeting, stairs or other portion of the Project, whether the pet belongs to the owner, tenant, or guest.

Unfortunately the HPP Maintenance Staff has had to clean up dog feces and urine in the hallways and on the 8th floor! Please kokua, carry your pets in the elevators and hallways, and clean up after them!
