## Holiday Butter Cookies

Sift together 2-2/3 cups sifted flour and 1/4 tsp. salt. Cream together in a bowl:

2 sticks butter

1 cup sugar

1 egg

1 tsp. vanilla

Beat mixture until creamy and light. Add the dry ingredients to the butter mixture. Take a teaspoon of dough and roll into a ball. Place on cookie sheet and flatten with your hand. Add nuts, candies or coconut for decoration. Bake at 375° F. for 7-10 minutes. Dough may be stored in refrigerator until ready.
